

WHAT'S HAPPENING AT THE LODGE

We are happy to report that we met our Capital Campaign challenge goal of raising \$25,000 by the end of May. An anonymous donor has therefore added \$25,000 to the fund, bringing the current total to approximately \$54,000. Everyone who donated deserves a pat on the back, but a reminder that our work is far from done. We need to raise \$100,000 before the end of the calendar year so we can replace our two failed boilers. This work will need to begin soon in order to have the new equipment ordered and installed before cold weather returns this fall. Your donation to the Capital



Campaign will be tax deductible through our new charitable 501(c)(3) corporation. We hope to have a monthly donation plan set up soon that will allow you to automatically give a specified amount each month. Please remember that you are investing in our Lodge's future.

POSTCARD FROM THE PAST



Antigo Lodge #662 received its charter on February 21, 1901. It held its first meetings in the Odd Fellows Hall. In 1906 the Lodge moved to the Masonic Temple. In 1917 it purchased its own property which was used for a clubhouse, though it was not large enough to hold Lodge meetings which continued to be held at the Masonic Temple. In 1919 all of the Lodge's records went up in flames when a fire destroyed its building. A ladies card party was being held there on the evening of December 1st. At first the women ignored the smoke, assuming it was the members smoking in the lounge. In 1931 the Antigo Elks built its present facility at 1622 Clermont Street. On February 23rd of that year, the grand opening of its new home was a gala event attended by Grand Exalted Ruler Lawrence Rupp and Grand Secretary J.E. Masters.

HARRY C. MARSH



1910-1993 Exalted Ruler 1940-1941

Harry Charles Marsh was born on August 1, 1910, in Neuvitus, Cuba, the son of Chauncey and Lydia Hub Marsh. His parents were married in 1909 in St. Anne, Illinois. When Harry was four years old, the family moved to North Dakota. In 1928 they resettled in Wisconsin, near DeForest where H.C. Marsh would reside the rest of his life. In 1936 he married Eloise Marguerite Edmunds in Waukegan, Illinois. For 58 years he was a roofer in Madison and ultimately became president of the Capital City Roofing Company. Marsh was a charter member and the first secretary of Roofer's Local #212. He helped develop the Badger School Boy Scout Troop and was a charter member of the Town of Madison Volunteer Fire Department. From 1940 until 1941 he was the Exalted Ruler of Madison Lodge #410.

Harry and Lydia had one son, Glenn Dale Marsh. Harry C. Marsh died on May 5, 1993, at age 82. His wife of 57 years died in 2007. They are buried in Blooming Grove Cemetery.
