MEMBERSHIP MATTERS

IMPORTANT REMINDER. Madison Elks Lodge 410 is a private club and a 501(c)(8) fraternal organization. Per the IRS only members and their guests can make use of its facilities (bar, dining room, and social gatherings). Members are permitted to bring guests, but any individual can only attend as a guest a maximum of three times per year. Certain exceptions apply. There are no limitations on spouses with valid identification cards using the Lodge facilities. There are no limitations on people attending charitable events where the proceeds go to a 501(c)(3) nonprofit charitable organization. We are also allowed to hold a limited number of entertainments that are open to the public (advertised as such). To remain in compliance with the law, you may and will be asked for your membership card, identification card, or membership number by staff members or officers of the Lodge.

Beginning in 2026 you will have the option of downloading a digital copy of your membership card to your phone or other mobile device. As with your printed membership card, the digital membership card can be used at our Lodge or any other Lodge in the country. To download the digital card requires that you are registered at Elks.org.

TAX DEDUCTIONS. Contributions made to these Elks charities are tax deductible: Elks National Foundation, Madison Elks Lodge 410 Foundation, Wisconsin Benevolent Fund, State Major Project (Camp Wawbeek), and the Elks National Veterans Service Commission. Contributions made at Lodge fundraisers benefiting 501(c)(3) charities such as Stand Down Madison, Custom Canines, Badger Honor Flight, Porchlight, Wil-Mar Neighborhood Center, Marquette Neighborhood Association, etc., are also tax deductible. POSTCARD FROM THE PAST



In 1921 Reno Lodge No. 597 organized the Nevada Elks Lake Tahoe Country Club, the membership of which is open to Nevada Elks only. The property consisted of 25 acres situated on the east shore of beautiful Lake Tahoe. One hundred and fourteen building lots were available to all members at actual cost price, and the membership included B.P.O.E. privileges.

In 1925 as houses were being built, the name was changed to Elk Point Country Club when it received its official designation as a nonprofit. Today, there are 91 homes. The age of the homes varies, from 100 years to brand new and from tiny rustic cabins to large modern estates. The private beach is rarely crowded. There is a roped-off swimming area and boat marina. The highway noise is blocked by Round Hill which affords wonderful views for anyone who hikes to its summit. Hiking and biking trails can be accessed directly from the residential community.

GEORGE C. SAYLE



1864 - 1951 Exalted Ruler 1915 - 1917

George Christopher Sayle, Jr., was born on Christmas Eve in 1864, the son of George C. Sayle, Sr., and Mary Delaney. His parents were born in Ireland and moved to Madison prior to the Civil War. George attended Washington School, located next door to the home he was born in on North Broom Street. He became a carpenter and helped build Science Hall on the UW campus. His interest in building eventually led to his own company, George C. Sayle Building & Manufacturing. As a builder and contractor, he would construct one of the first houses in University Heights and many other homes throughout the city. In 1907 he retired from the construction business to concentrate on managing the numerous apartment buildings he owned.

Sayle was elected an alderman in 1895, then council president in 1897 and again in 1903. He served two terms as mayor, 1916 – 1920. Upon completion of his service as mayor, he was appointed to the Fire and Police Commission. He remained a member of the commission until 1937. George was also active in the Madison Parks and Pleasure Drive Association which was instrumental in building the Tenney Park locks.

A founding member of Madison Elks Lodge 410, George was elected its third Exalted Ruler in 1915 and reelected in 1916. He was also a member of the Knights of Columbus.

George Sayle married Sarah Keyes on October 24, 1891, and they were the parents of a son and a daughter. George died on July 16, 1951, and is buried with his wife in Madison's Resurrection Cemetery.


