



POSTCARD FROM THE PAST



At 11 o'clock on the night of September 18, 1989, Paul Lernack, 23, and Tammy Barcar, 24, sat at the end of the pier at the Madison Elks Lodge. From out of seemingly nowhere emerged a speeding boat that crashed into the pier, collapsing it. The pilot of the 170-horsepower inboard motorboat, Mark Willmsen, 24, claimed he couldn't see the dock even though it was floodlit. His uninsured boat sank and the two sitting on the pier were taken to the hospital with injuries, treated and released. Willmsen's blood alcohol tested level was below the legal definition of being intoxicated. However, He had three previous boating citations and was later charged with several other offenses, including reckless endangerment of life.

RICHARD ELI WILLIAMS



1913-1985 Exalted Ruler 1957-1958

Richard Eli "Dick" Williams was born on March 2, 1913, in Soldiers Grove Wisconsin, the son of Stephen Arthur Williams and Ada Estella Treakle. He was named after his grandfather who was born in Wales and immigrated to the United States after the Civil War. Dick grew up in North Dakota and Wisconsin, eventually settling in Madison where he graduated from Central High School in 1930. He attended the University of Wisconsin part-time and worked for the National Youth Administration. With the advent of World War II, William enlisted in the U.S. Navy and served in China, Burma and India.

After the war Dick returned to Madison and the University of Wisconsin where he received a degree in accounting. On November 22, 1945, he married Harriet Jane Edwards of Waukegan, Illinois, also a student at the UW. In 1950 Williams received a law degree and eventually would become an inheritance tax counsel for the Wisconsin Department of Revenue.

Mr. and Mrs. Williams were active in Madison Elks Lodge 410 and he was elected Exalted Ruler in 1957. He was also a member of the Lions Club, Optimist Club, Moose Lodge and Madison Scouts Drum and Bugle Corps. The couple had a son and a daughter.

Upon his death on January 6, 1985, he had an Elks memorial service conducted by all the living Past Exalted Rulers of our Lodge. He is buried with his wife in Roselawn Memorial Park.

We also replaced the ceiling tiles in our banquet prep room (behind the bar on the lower level). That space is now much brighter and more inviting to perspective renters.

One Friday night in January, a series of dining room lights went out. Fortunately, our own Master Electrician Dan Rustick who was there to sell pull tabs replaced a circuit breaker on the fly. Dan is now in the process of replacing all the breakers in the main panel as a matter of preventive maintenance. We are lucky to have talented Lodge members like Dan who are able to contribute their talents!

Our Lodge has contracted with Air Temp Services to provide regular heating, ventilation and air conditioning maintenance. We've been without a service provider for quite a while so it's good to have someone again to maintain our HVAC System.

At our January membership meeting, an expenditure of \$1,850 was approved to upgrade our HVAC controls. Once completed, our new boilers will be working at peak efficiency. At the same meeting members approved an expenditure of \$1,305 to replace a noisy and failing motor on our water heater.

Our big project for 2024 is to have our parking lot professionally refreshed. This will involve filling cracks, sealing and re-striping parking lines. We are in the process of collecting quotes. More to come!

Our Building and Grounds Committee is chipping away at resolving some long overdue upgrades and we are confident that our Lodge will be in much better condition as we move forward.
