

It's scholarship season! If you know a high school senior, encourage them to apply for an Elks scholarship. There are two types: the Most Valuable Student scholarship is open to any high school senior, regardless of Elks affiliation. Legacy Awards are only available to children and grandchildren of Elks members. Go here to learn more about each one. The deadline for the MVS scholarship is November 12. The deadline for Legacy Awards is February 2, 2026.

Finally, I'm going to make another plea to members to sign up for the ENF Fidelity Club. For as little as \$5 per month, you can show your support for the Elks National Foundation without even thinking about it. You sign up one time with a bank account number or credit card and then forget it. It's by far the easiest way to support this valuable program. ELKS NATIONAL FOUNDATION ANNOUNCES 2026 SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES



The Elks National Foundation (ENF) is proud to continue its legacy of supporting higher education by announcing the application periods for its 2026 scholarship programs. The Elks, through their charitable work, help build stronger communities by investing in our youth. Last year alone, the ENF awarded over \$3.9 million to students across the nation.

Here is what you and your family need to know about the upcoming scholarship opportunities.

Most Valuable Student (MVS) Scholarship

The Most Valuable Student scholarship is open to all high school seniors who are U.S. citizens—there is no requirement to be related to an Elks member.

Award: 500 four-year awards are available, ranging from \$4,000 to \$30,000. The awards are based on academics,

leadership, service, and financial need.

Application Period: Open until November 12, 2025.

How to Apply: Submit your application online through the ENF website at http://enf.elks.org/MVS.

Winner Announcement: Winners will be announced in April 2026.

Legacy Awards

The Legacy Awards program provides scholarships exclusively for children and grandchildren of duespaying Elks members.

Eligibility: The applicant must be a high school senior and a child or grandchild of a qualifying Elk. The application must be sponsored by the Lodge of the Elk member.

Award: Legacy Awards are \$4,000 scholarships, with the total number of awards announced in April 2026.

• Application Period: Open until February 2, 2026.

Community Service Requirement: Recipients must complete at least three service acts with an Elks Lodge during their college career.


POSTCARD FROM THE PAST



The oldest continuously operating Elks Lodge is San Francisco Lodge #3, located in Union Square.

Groundbreaking ceremonies for the current building were held on August 25, 1923, with construction beginning the following day. The project had a final cost of \$1,500,000. The building located at 450 Post Street was dedicated on May 27, 1925, to the 3,000 members of the Lodge. Ceilings in the main dining room and over the twenty-seven by seventy-five-foot swimming pool were hand painted ceramic tiles. The fifteen-story building contained over 100 bedrooms for member residents and visiting Elks. The Lodge room had a seating capacity of 1,000 with a projection room, maple stage, and pipe organ. San Francisco also boasted a billiard room, library, bakery, gym, barbershop, steam room and much more.

Today San Francisco Elks Lodge #3 shares its space with the Kensington Park Hotel, with the Lodge exclusively occupying the third floor of the building.

GEORGE W. LEVIS

George Washington Levis was born on October 15, 1861, in Black River Falls, Wisconsin, the son of John Simenson Levis and Emeline Ingeborg Oldsdatter Gullord. His fourth great-grandfather, Samuel Levis, a Quaker, settled near Philadelphia, arriving with William Penn in 1682. His second great-grandfather, Seamuel Levis II, served in the Revolutionary War. His father left Pennsylvania for Black River Falls in 1854 and ran a lumber business there.

George Attended the University of Wisconsin in Madison and graduated from the Law School in 1893. He practiced as an attorney between 1893 and 1896 in West Superior and La Crosse. Levis permanently moved to Madison in 1896 when he took a position as a Deputy United States Marshall. In 1900 he became the head of the Starks-Levis Land Company.

George W. Levis was active in politics and ran unsuccessfully both for the state assembly and congress. He was known throughout the state for his public speaking abilities and often the emcee for political rallies and civic events. George belonged to the Masons, Modern Woodsman of America, Mystic Workers of the World, and Unitarian Society. He was a founding member of Madison Elks Lodge 410 and served as its second Exalted Ruler between 1898 and 1900.

Levis married his first wife Claire Marie Winden on December 27, 1893, at Black Earth. They had a son and a daughter. Their son, George Wyden Levis, was twice an All-American basketball player while at the University of Wisconsin in Madison from 1912 to 1916. He was also the Helms Foundation National Player of the Year as a senior in 1916. He graduated from the University of Wisconsin and became the head coach at Indiana University during the 1920, 1921, and 1922 seasons.



After George Washington Levis' wife died in 1896, he married Susan Speckner, the widow of Gustaf Findorff, on October 31, 1903, in Madison. They had one daughter.

George W. Levis died on August 14, 1909, at his summer home on Long Lake in Washburn County. He is buried with both his wives and other family members in Madison's Forest Hill Cemetery.



Our Lodge exterior fall cleanup day is scheduled for October 25. We always have coffee and world-class cookies, courtesy of LaVerne Schwengel. Mark your calendar for October 25 at 9:00 a.m. We'll be doing some raking, trimming and general tidying up. It's always a good time to enjoy the fall weather and get to know your fellow Elks.

LaVerne Schwengel once again managed to keep our exterior in bloom all summer. She'd like to recognize the following members who helped her with the ground's maintenance: Kris Gordon, Ben Hager, Lu Vail, Alex Dogara, Jody Rasmussen, and Audrey Martino. Thank you to all!

Our heating and air conditioning contractor, Air Temperature Services, will be installing a new exhaust fan for our restrooms this month. The cost will be \$2,074. This is a long-overdue project as the old fan has not been functioning for several years. The restrooms will be more comfortable, especially in the summer. The exhaust fan serves to draw air-conditioned air into the restrooms as well as to keep the restrooms supplied with fresh air throughout the year.

We are going to be adding a mop sink to our kitchen. As commercial kitchens go, we've got a nice one. It's spacious and well-equipped. Still, we are always looking to make it more functional for our staff and we decided a mop sink was in order. Pertzborn Plumbing will be installing one soon at the cost of \$1,780.

After two refrigeration units needed major maintenance last month, one of our coolers behind the bar needed a new compressor at the cost of \$1,400. Our trusty refrigeration contractor, JustinTime Refrigeration, got it fixed quickly so we were without it for two days of business.


