This month the last two of the neighborhood festivals that our Lodge sponsored will take place. The Orton Park Festival is August 25-27 in Orton Park. This is its 58th year, making it one of the longest running music festivals in the country. It also features craft and food venders. Sessions at McPike Park wraps up August 11, 12, 16 and 17. It is the largest annual, multi-day music festival in the city and features both local and international performers. Both of these celebrations are great fun, free to attend and benefit many nonprofits in our community. Music Bingo continues to be popular and returns again on August 16 (always the 3rd Wednesday of the month between 6 and 8 p.m.). SCHOLARSHIPS

The Most Valuable Student (MVS) Scholarship Contest for 2024 opens on August 1, 2023.

Current high school seniors (or the equivalent) who are citizens of the United States are eligible to apply. Applicants do not need to be related to an Elks member. Applicants must be citizens of the United States on the date their applications are submitted (permanent legal resident status does not qualify). All applications are completed online. Students pick the lodge through which they apply. Boys and girls compete separately. All information is available on the elks.org website under ENF scholarships.

In the 2024 competition at the national level, the 500 highest-rated applicants will be awarded four-year scholarships. The Elks National Foundation will donate a total of \$2,440,000 in scholarships to these winners.

The national awards range from \$1,000 per year to \$12,500 per year for four years. Most Valuable Student scholarships are for students pursuing a four-year degree, on a full-time basis (minimum of 12 semester hours), in a U.S. college or university. All scholarships are in the form of certificates of award conditional upon the full-time enrollment of the winner in an accredited U.S. college or university. Students who plan on attending a technical school are not eligible for this scholarship.

In addition to national awards, Wisconsin also distributes state awards based on the students' scores within each district and on a state level. Our Lodge awards the top three boys and top three girls each \$500 scholarships. The Ladies Auxiliary also awards 2-3 scholarships each year.

All six of our winners were members of various honor societies and maintained very high grade point averages (4.0 for the most part) throughout their high school career. They all participated in many school activities and sports and put in a lot of volunteer community service hours. We awarded each of them \$500 scholarships from our charities account. POSTCARD FROM THE PAST



Early in 1893 a group of twenty-eight young men, residents of Green Bay, banded together for the purpose of establishing an Elks Lodge. On March 15th they received their charter as Green Bay Lodge #259. Its first meetings were held at the Knights of Pythias Hall in the Duchateau Building on Main Street. In 1902 the lodge moved into its own building on the corner of Jefferson and Cherry Streets. This was the first Elks clubhouse built in the state. By 1939 the membership had grown and the Lodge needed more room, but it would be another 20 years until the Green Bay Elks would move to a larger facility. Located at the corner of South Adams and Crooks Streets, the modern two-story building costing \$200,000 was dedicated on November 7, 1959. It would remain the home for the Green Bay Lodge until 1995 when the lodge moved to its present location at 3195 S. Ridge Rd.

JOHN S. HOBBINS



1904-1963 Exalted Ruler 1948-1949

John Suhr Hobbins was born in Madison on February 25, 1904, the son of William James Hobbins and Bertha Beatrice Suhr. He was a scion of two of Madison's most distinguished pioneer families. His grandfather, John J. Suhr, founded the American Exchange Bank. His great grandfather, William Hobbins, and his great uncle, Joseph Hobbins, were prominent physicians.

John attended Madison (Central) High School and graduated with a BA degree from the University of Wisconsin in 1926. While there he was a member of the Sigma Nu fraternity and captain of the varsity baseball team. He also attended UW Law School for one year. Later in life, he would become a member of the University's Board of Visitors and a director of the University of Wisconsin Alumni Association.

John's first employment was as an auditor with the Anaconda Mining Company in Montana. During that time he married Margaret Mary Perham in Butte on May 10, 1930. In 1936 he and his wife moved to Madison where he worked at the American Exchange Bank for the rest of his life.

Hobbins like so many in his family was a community leader, serving as treasurer of the Chamber of Commerce, chairperson of the Cancer Crusade, treasurer of the Wisconsin Mental Health Association, and as director of the United Givers (United Way). In 1956 he ran for Mayor, losing to Ivan Nestingen. John Hobbins was also president of the Salvation Army Advisory Board and president and treasurer of the Dane County Conservation League. In 1948 he was elected Exalted Ruler of the Madison Elks Lodge.

Hobbins was also an avid sportsman and onetime president of the Maple Bluff Country Club. He died on August 13, 1963, at age 59. His wife, Margaret died in 1983. They are buried in Madison's Resurrection Cemetery. The couple had three children, a son and two daughters.

[A personal note: When my family moved from Madison in 1961, John and Margaret Hobbins purchased our house at 309 Del Mar Dr.]

BUILDING & GROUNDS

Our committee continues to meet monthly to work on projects to improve our lodge.

We wish to recognize Dan Nardi and Jon Jenson who volunteered to replace a large section of drywall in the lower level men's bathroom and paint the entire room. The ceiling had suffered some damage from a valve leak in the bathroom above. Everything is repaired and looking great.

We also wish to recognize LaVerne Schwengel, Dave Gillette, and Maria Antoinette for keeping our yard and flowers watered and looking beautiful. Our well-attended Thursday night concert series has been a great success and the beautiful grounds only make it nicer.

As a cost-saving measure, our committee is taking on the tasks of cleaning windows and fertilizing our lawn. We have discontinued hiring these tasks out. This action will save our lodge \$1,700 annually.

Lodge member and retired electrician Dan Rustick will coordinate replacing all the recessed lighting in the lower level. The old light fixtures were failing. The lodge membership voted in July to spend \$1,200 to replace all the fixtures and dimmer switches so the lights would work properly.

Finally, we are close to completing our purchase of two new boilers to heat our lodge. We are fortunate to have several very knowledgeable members in our lodge who are assisting with the evaluation of bids from several local HVAC vendors. Approval for one of the bids will come before the membership at our August membership meeting.

Our committee is focused on saving costs and improving our lodge for our members and guest to enjoy. Members are welcome to attend our monthly committee meetings.
