#### POSTCARD FROM THE PAST



Photo of the back of the new clubhouse pictured in the March 15, 1965, Capital Times. The caption states, "...workmen rushed to complete the structure for Saturday's event – the initiation of 73 new members." This initiation on March 20th was the first held at the new facility and would be the largest group ever initiated by the Madison Lodge. That year the membership numbered over 1,500 and would peak at over 2,000 in 1989. The new clubhouse opened a little less than a year after the ground breaking the preceding April. At the official opening and installation of the cornerstone on March 28, 1965, the kitchen and lower level remained unfinished. About twenty years later, the appearance of the building changed dramatically when both the front and back were extended, enclosing the open arcades.

#### **JAMES JOYCE**



1915-1999 Exalted Ruler 1962-1963

James Joyce, the son of John Harry Joyce and Erma Mary Kitson, was born near Richland Center, Wisconsin, on August 28, 1915. His great grandparents emigrated from Ireland and were pioneer settlers of Richland County. After graduating from Richland Center High School, James moved to Lancaster, Wisconsin, to learn how to become a mortician. He married his lifetime sweetheart, Avis Lillian Weeden, on February 18, 1941. In April of the same year, he was inducted into the U.S. Army, but was released in the fall and returned in Wisconsin.

Two years later, the Army told Joyce to report to Air Corps training in Georgia where he made his first solo flight. He then went to Arkansas to learn how to fly twin-engine planes at high altitudes. Second Lieutenant James Joyce received his wings in the United States Army Air Corps on August 30, 1943. Early in 1944 he was shipped off first to North Africa and then to Italy where he flew B-24 heavy bombers.

After flying over 50 bombing missions and surviving both a crash landing and injury from flak, Lt. Joyce considered himself a lucky man. In 1944 just having received the Distinguished Flying Cross, he briefly visited his wife in Madison before returning to duty. John boarded the Dixie Flyer in Chicago to take him back to his outfit in Miami. At about 2 a.m. on September 14 near Terre Haute, Indiana, the passenger train collided head on with an express mail train. Twenty-two air veterans were killed and 40 critically injured. Joyce escaped from the crash unscathed.

After the war James and his wife Avis settled in Madison. He was a commander of Post 134 of the American Legion and belonged to both the Forty and Eight Veterans Organization and the Knights of Columbus. Joyce was a lifetime member of Madison Elks Lodge #410 and elected Exalted Ruler in 1962. He loved observing Flag Day at the Lodge and letting others know that the B.P.O.E. were responsible for establishing the June 14 holiday.

James and Avis Joyce had five sons and one daughter. He died on January 14, 1999, and his wife died on December 18, 2009. They are buried in Resurrection Cemetery.
