FRANK J. RANE



1922 - 2007
Exalted Ruler
2004 - 2006

Frank Joseph Rane was born on November 9, 1922, in Madison, the son of Giuseppe Bastillo Reina and Concetta Maria Bongiovanni. His parents were born in Sicily and immigrated to the United States in 1907. Frank was a lifelong resident of Madison, attended St. Joseph's Grade School, Madison Central High School, and Madison Vocational School (MATC). During World War II, in served in the United States Army Air Force with the 45th Air Depot Group and the Ninth Air Force Command stationed in England, France, Belgium, and Germany. After leaving the service he attended the University of Wisconsin in Madison. On June 28, 1947, he married Naomi Boyd. The couple had two sons.

Frank Rane was immensely proud of his Italian heritage and longtime membership in the Italian Workmen's Club, serving as its president for five years. He and his lifelong friend Nick Stassi were instrumental in the placement of a monument at the corner of Regent Street and East Campus Mall that commemorates the old Greenbush neighborhood. Twice he was elected president of the South Madison Optimist Club and a lifetime member of the V.F.W. Post No. 1318. Frank was also a life member of Madison Elks Lodge No. 410 and served as its Exalted Ruler from 2004 until 2006.

Together with his wife Naomi, they operated a grocery and liquor business in Madison's southside neighborhood for 43 years. They also owned and operated Arbor Liquors on the West Beltline Highway and Rane Barrel on West Gilman Street.

Frank Rane died on March 25, 2007, and is interred with his wife in Sunset Memory Gardens.

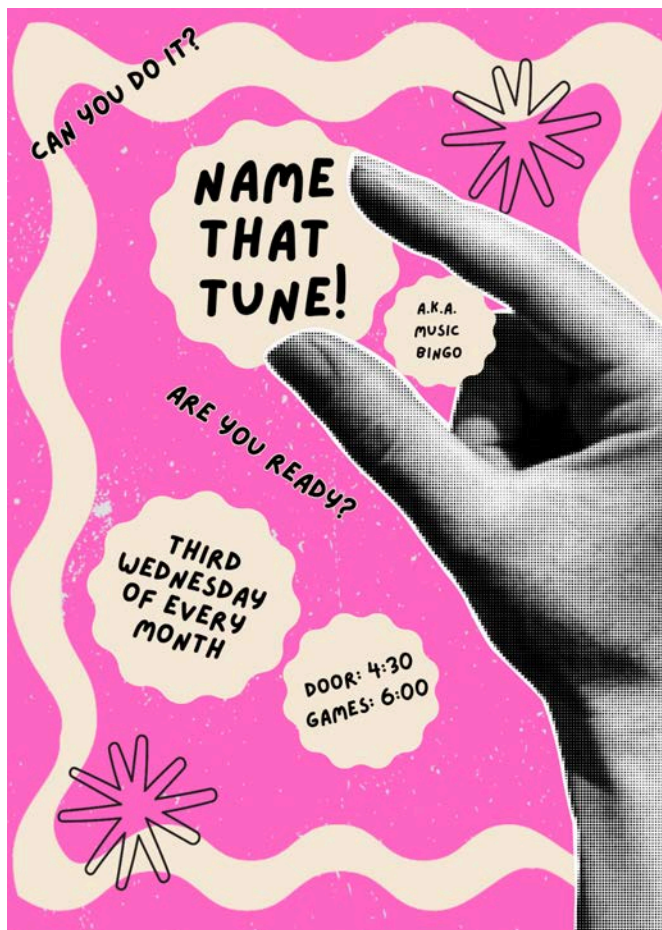

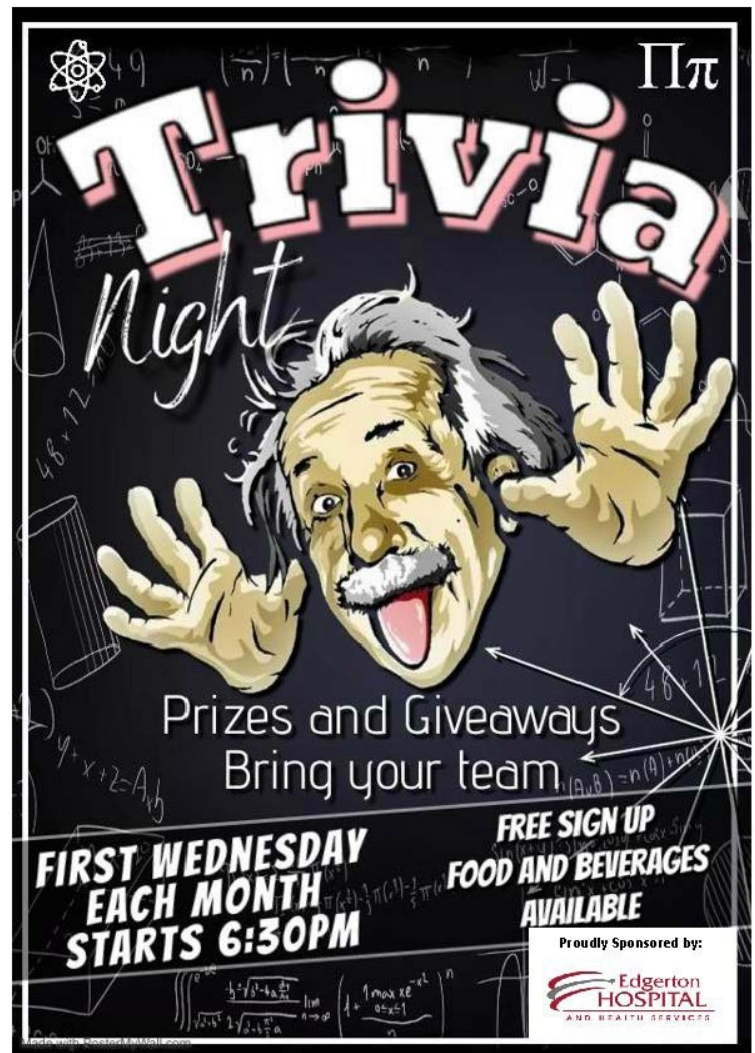
