POSTCARD FROM THE PAST



An illustration of the Capital House, from the 1858-1859 Madison City Directory. This first-class hotel opened in 1853 at the corner of Main Street and Monona Avenue (now Martin Luther King, Jr., Boulevard). Constructed of native sandstone, it was for many years considered the city's finest hotel. It served as a temporary clubhouse for Madison Elks #410 until a permanent home was erected a block away in 1902.


NELS A. LADD

1870 - 1950 Exalted Ruler 1898 Nelson Albert "Nels" Ladd was born in the town of Pleasant Springs, Wisconsin, on March 11, 1870, the son of Erik Ericksen Ladd and Bertene Nelson Barentson. His parents were born in Norway and immigrated to the United States in 1852.

Ladd moved to Madison as a young man and was involved in the management of both the Capital

House and the Capital Hotel. He was a justice of the peace, served on the city's fire and police commission, and ran for the state assembly 1902. Nels was an officer in the Knights of Pythias, a director of the Independent Scandinavian Workingmen's Association, and a member of the Woodsmen of the World and the Madison Skat Club.

In 1898 Nels Ladd married Christine Huppeler. In January of that same year, he and several other young businessmen met with William De Steese of Fond du Lac Elks Lodge #57 to discuss establishing an Elks Lodge in Madison. On March 11, 1898, Elks Lodge #410 was installed as the newest chapter of the B.P.O.E., becoming the largest

Lodge in the state (an honor we hold to this day). Initiation of the Madison members took place that afternoon at the Knights of Pythias Hall. Nels Ladd was appointed Madison's first Exalted Ruler. A lavish banquet followed at 11 p.m., held at the Capital House. Two weeks later on March 26th, officers were elected for the coming year with George W. Levis selected Exalted Ruler and Nels Ladd the representative to the Grand Lodge. Ladd also served as treasurer and was an avid member of the Jolly Corks Bowling Club.

Nels Ladd moved to Austin, Texas, in 1910 where he owned the Avenue Hotel and the Hancock Hotel. He died there on September 20, 1950, and is buried with his wife in Austin's Mount Calvary Cemetery.



A big thank you goes out to all the volunteers who helped move furniture to allow for our biannual carpet cleaning. It took less than an hour each day to move the furniture off and then back on the carpet. Many hands make light work!

We've had several expensive repairs this past month. Two of our kitchen refrigeration units needed maintenance to the tune of \$2,800. We have quality equipment, but maintenance is to be expected on any mechanical equipment over time.

We also had a couple minor plumbing leaks that we've been meaning to address and finally did so this month. Repairs were completed for \$1,800.

We also updated our Wi-Fi system. It was long overdue. Now we have a strong Wi-Fi signal not only for our members and guests to use but necessary for our new POS (point of sale) system. This computerized system allows our staff to keep track of bar and dining sales and charge your credit card. We purchased handheld devices for our servers, and our kitchen staff will work off an electronic display. We are keeping up with the times!
