LODGE NEWS

On Wednesday, September 6, from noon until 5 p.m., member Renée Lauber is coordinating a blood drive with the Red Cross at the Lodge, something we have not hosted for several years. We hope to make this an annual event, but we will need a good turnout this year to schedule a future

As an additional incentive, we invite donors to drop off any documents they need shredded. Documents (paper only!) should be bagged (a limit of three grocery bags per member). You may drop off your documents to be shredded during the blood drive, Wednesday, September 6 between noon and 5 p.m., or at the office on Thursday, September 7, and Friday, September 8, between 10 a.m. and 1 p.m. Please do not leave any documents to be shredded at any other times! Donors will also receive a coupon good for a free haircut from Sports Cuts, a t-shirt from the Red Cross and free refreshments courtesy of the Lodge.

This event is on the lower level and open to the public so please encourage your friends and neighbors to come.

In an ongoing effort to improve dining at the Lodge we have introduced a new menu for fall and winter. Prime rib has returned as the Saturday Night Special and, of course, we still have Friday Night Fish Fry. We are also diligently trying to find staff to improve service.

Thank you for all the volunteers who staffed our Elk's tent (and dispensed beer) at the Orton Park Festival the last weekend in August. We also appreciate all those who helped

make our summer concert series, Live @ the Lodge, great fun and a resounding success. Special thanks to our corporate sponsor, Madison Tops, who paid for all the bands. The proceeds from the 50-50 raffles will be donated to the Capital Campaign.

Please note two items we will be voting on at the September 13 membership meeting. We will vote to ratify the proposed bylaw changes read and discussed at the August 9 meeting. Also, like every other Lodge in the nation, we will vote on whether to ratify an amendment to the Elks constitution adopted at its convention in July. The amendment drops the word "ladies" from references to "auxiliaries" in our statutes.

MEMBERSHIP MATTERS

Next month marks the halfway point in our Elks fiscal year, April 1 - March 31. Our goal is to finish the year with 800 or more members. We were fortunate to be one of only a few Lodges in the state to have had a net gain in membership for the past two years. It is important that we continue to attract new members, especially younger members, so that we remain viable as an organization in the future. We currently have 759 members, 57 delinquent members (members who not paid their dues for the current fiscal year), and 12 candidates for membership. The average age of our members is 64.9 - down from 69.9 two years ago. To date this year we have initiated 50 new members. If you haven't paid your dues, please do so. If you are suffering financial hardship, please let the Secretary know. Also, please bring your friends and work associates to the Lodge and then sponsor them for membership.

POSTCARD FROM THE PAST



Fond du Lac Elks Lodge No. 57 was the second Elks Lodge in Wisconsin, chartered on November 27, 1886. Constructed in 1904, its Queen Ann-style clubhouse stood at the corner of Sheboygan and Portland Streets. Designed by local architect Adolph Werner, it cost \$40,000 and boasted the oldest sanctioned bowling alley in the state. After a six-month suspension late in 2015 and the loss of it building in March of the following year, the Grand Lodge revoked its charter.

JOSEPH L. STARR



1885-1955 Exalted Ruler 1922-1923

Joseph Leo Starr was born in Madison on June 9, 1885, the son of Michael and Catherine Fitzpatrick Starr. Both of his parents were born in Ireland and pioneer residents of our city. Starr attended high school his freshman year and then enrolled in the Midland Night Normal School, a predecessor of Madison Business College. On January 30, 1917, he married Gertrude Sylvia Lucey whose parents helped settle Mazomanie.

His first job was washing bottles at the Rocky Mountain Tea Company. Joseph's charming personality spurred his promotion to an advertising salesman for the company, then manager of his department and finally as vice president of what had become Hollister, Inc., a pharmaceutical manufacturer. In 1950 the business was sold to a Pennsylvania drug company. Beginning in 1920 Joseph Starr served two terms as alderman for the 1st ward, the area downtown where he lived all his life. During his term in office, he was instrumental in making traffic one way around the Capitol Square, passing the city's first zoning ordinance, purchasing land for Breese Stevens Stadium and allowing Glenway Golf Course to occupy property purchased for the expansion of Forest Hill Cemetery.

At one time or another, J. L. Starr was president of the Madison Advertising Club, Madison Society of Accountants, United Travelers' Protective Association, and Madison Bowling Association. He was active in Rotary, the Knights of Columbus and keenly involved with the effort of the St. Vincent de Paul Society to develop South Madison. Most of all he was committed to the Elks, serving as a Trustee and Exalted Ruler of the Madison Lodge, and Vice President of the Wisconsin Elks Association.

Star was an avid ice skater, bowler, golfer and Milwaukee Braves fan. He died on May 12, 1955, and is buried with his wife and other family members in Madison's Resurrection Cemetery.
