### **MEMBERSHIP MATTERS**

In 1965, the year we moved into our current building, we had 1,500+ members. In 1986 membership peaked at about 2,000 members. Membership then gradually begin to decline. In 2020 membership was 616. For the next four years we have seen a net gain in membership - 67 this past year. Currently we have 739 members, but we still have 165 who have not paid their dues for this year. We have 11 candidates for new membership. During the last fiscal year we had 12 members pass away (our average age is 65 years old, down from 70 in 2020). We had 47 members who did not renew their membership at the end of the year. We had six members who transferred to other Lodges. We had two members who transferred to our Lodge from another Lodge. We had four lapsed members who reinstated their membership.

An increase in membership translates into more potential revenue for the restaurant and bar, higher event attendance, more volunteers, and more charitable contributions and more donations to the Capital Campaign. It is also important to note that an increase in membership does not significantly increase the overhead to operate the Lodge - utilities, maintenance, or repairs. It does make it more cost effective. If you have not done so already, please pay your dues. Please make it a goal this year to sponsor at least one new member... a family member, a friend, a coworker. They will thank you.

Please make sure we not only have your correct address, but your preferred phone number and email address. Volunteers will soon be contacting all members to make sure our information is current.













### POSTCARD FROM THE PAST



On Sunday, June 17, 1945, about 400 persons attended the Flag Ceremony at Roselawn Memorial Park when the official Elks Rest of Madison Lodge #410 was dedicated. Officers led by Exalted Ruler Arthur M. Kurtz performed the ceremony. The 12-grave plot donated by Roselawn Memorial Park is for the benefit of Elks who have no families and who were unable to arrange for their own burial. A bronze plaque marks the plot slightly northwest of the carillon tower. (The photograph was taken by The Capital Times but not appear in the newspaper.)

### KENNETH KALHAGEN



1923 - 2018 Exalted Ruler 1999-2001

Kenneth Leroy "Ken" Kalhagen was born on February 11, 1923, in Dane County, the son of Alfred Oli Kalhagen and Inga Olive Taie. His grandfather was born in Norway and as a young man immigrated to Stoughton, Wisconsin. Ken graduated from Madison East High School in 1942. Then, he enlisted in the U.S. Navy along with his brothers, Alfred and Bertrand – his brother Magnus joined the U.S. Army. Seaman Kenneth Kalhagen served as a torpedoman aboard the destroyer USS Bush (DD-529), named for William Sharp Bush, USMC. His ship saw action throughout the Pacific during World War II. Returning home, Ken married Dorothy Swan on May 17, 1946, and together they raised three children. Dorothy passed away in 1995.

Detective Supervisor Kalhagen worked for the Madison Police Department for 32 years and received the Meritorious Service Award in 1959. He was a member of the Madison Elks Lodge and served two terms as Exalted Ruler between 1999 and 2001. Ken was also a lifetime member of VFW Post 8483, and a member of the Tin Can Sailors and the East Side Club.

On November 22, 1997, he married his second wife, Wanda Marie Pearson Koenig – she also served as Exalted Ruler of our Lodge (2007-2008). Ken loved carpentry work and built two houses of his own, as well as helping build the homes of his children. He also enjoyed pheasant hunting and ice fishing with his brothers and camping throughout the United States and Canada. Ken Kalhagen died on November 12, 2018 and is buried in Roselawn Memorial Park.


