MEMBERSHIP MATTERS

We like to use the phrase “membership matters,” but why exactly does it matter?

First a little history about membership numbers at the Madison Elks Lodge. It all begins in 1898 when about a dozen of the city’s movers and shakers established Madison Lodge No. 410. It quickly grew to 500 members. By 1954, its 1,500 members had outgrown their downtown clubhouse at the corner of Monona Avenue (Martin Luther King, Jr., Boulevard) and Doty Street. The original building, considered spacious and luxurious when constructed in 1903, was now cramped and outdated. There was no air conditioning or parking. The basement bowling allies were removed to accommodate a larger bar and restaurant, increasing popular benefits of membership. A search began for a new location, which is how we got to where we are now. The new facility opened in 1965, and membership quickly rose to 1,700. Membership continued to rise until it peaked at about 2,000 in the mid-1980s. Then began a steady decline witnessed by most fraternal organizations. By 2019 our membership had shrunk to an all-time low of 617.

The good news is that membership is once again on the rise. No doubt this can be credited to our greatest assets, our lakeside location and members committed to improving our Lodge and our community.

But back to the original question, why does size matter? Quite simply, more members mean more revenue which means more opportunities. The ability to add more clubhouse amenities

and upgrade infrastructure. Better dining and events. Increased charitable donations and a larger presence in our community.

Ironically, one of the best sources for new members are new members themselves. Newly initiated Elks are the most likely to recruit candidates for membership.

We all want our Lodge to grow and succeed. It will with a little effort by all of us. Please bring a friend, work colleague, relative, or neighbor into the Lodge and make sure they leave with an application. 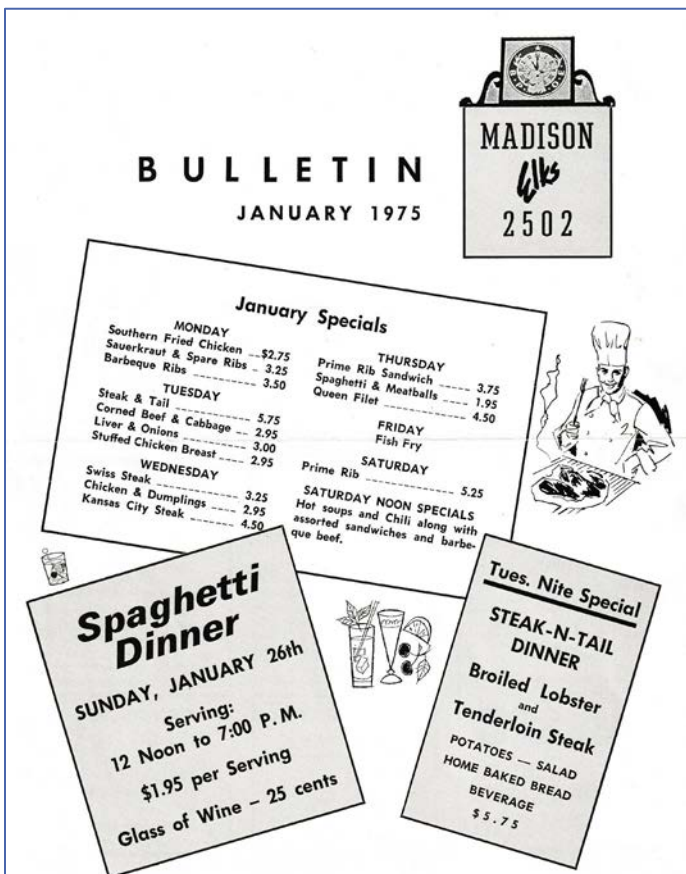

POSTCARD FROM THE PAST

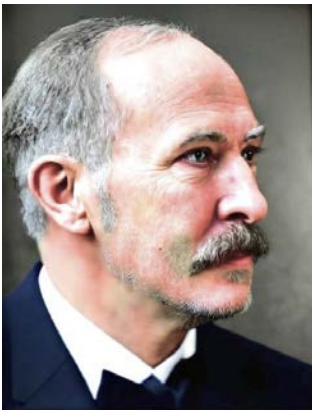


Prices aside, the cover of the January 1975 newsletter is noteworthy for several reasons. First, it was yet to be called the ‘Elkliner,’ but simply known as the “Bulletin.” Also, please note the number of the Madison Lodge is “2502” rather than “410.” How did that happen?

In 1973 Madison Lodge 410 members voted to eliminate the “whites only” clause as a qualification for membership. Previously at the national convention, Madison delegates fought unsuccessfully to have this discriminatory practice deleted from the B.P.O.E.’s constitution. The response from the Grand Lodge was that on March 20, 1973, it revoked the charter of Madison Elks 410. After a successful legal challenge, the B.P.O.E. changed its constitution and reinstated our charter on March 10, 1974. However, they assigned us a new number, 2502. Needless to say, that did not go down well with our members. On April 1, 1976, our original number of 410 was restored. (Both charters are now displayed in the lobby.)

This newsletter promotes what became the annual Spaghetti Dinner. This is the first reference in print that I have found for this event which makes it at least 51 years old! Also, note that the dining room is open Monday through Saturday for lunch and dinner. Today our Lodge has a full-service restaurant open Wednesday through Sunday, and we are the only Lodge in our state that can make that claim.

JOHN C. FEHLAND, JR.

Johann Carl “John” Fehland, Jr., was born on December 27, 1859, in Mecklenburg, Germany, the son of Johann Carl Heinrich Fehland and Maria Sophia Elise Niebuhr. The family immigrated to the United States in 1864. John married Lizetta “Zettie” Hamm on January 15, 1882, in Mazomanie, Wisconsin. The couple had two daughters and a son.

In 1892 John graduated from the University of Wisconsin Law School. Later the same year he became a United States citizen. In addition to practicing law in Madison, he served as a municipal and superior court judge for many years.

Judge Fehlandt was active in many civic organizations including the Masons, Loyal Order of Moose, Odd Fellows, and served as the director of the North American Skat Association. He was an early member of Madison Lodge 410 and served as its Exalted Ruler from 1912 to 1913.

John Carl Fehland, Jr., died on July 4, 1916, and is buried with his wife in Forest Hill Cemetery.

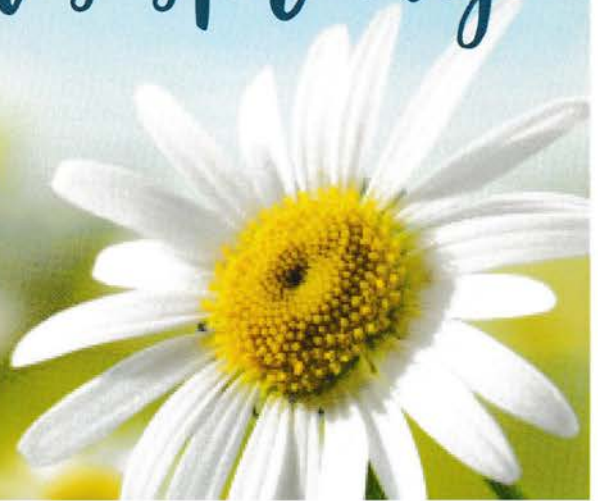
