It not only is the beginning of a new calendar year, but a new year of Elkdom looms on the horizon. Our fiscal

year is April 1 – March 31 and in preparation for the transition, your annual dues statement will be mailed to you by the Grand Lodge this month. Your local and state dues for 2026-2027 will remain the same and your national dues will only go up \$1. We hope you will pay your dues upon receipt of your statement, either by mailing us a check in the reply envelope furnished, or by using a credit card online at https:elks.org/payonline.

We will begin to mail out new member cards, spouse cards and key cards in February, but please continue to use your current identification and purple key cards until April 1. If you are a widow or widower of a deceased member, you should automatically receive an identification card in the mail in March.

Election of officers for 2026-2027 will be held at the membership meeting February 25. Nominations for officers may be made at the January 14 and February 11 meetings. Nominations from the floor on the night of the election can only be made if there are no candidates for that office.

POSTCARD FROM THE PAST



The original Madison Elks Lodge (pictured here around 1912) was located downtown at the corner of Doty Street on what was then Monona Avenue (Martin Luther King, Jr., Blvd. today). It is the building with the flag on the far left. Immediately to its right is the Grand Army of Republic (G.A.R.) Hall, and the building next to it is the Avenue Hotel. The cornerstone of the first Lodge was laid at 11 p.m. on October 22, 1901. The building and its neighbors were razed in 1964 to make way for a parking lot for the Bank of Madison. Attorney Vaughn Conway purchased the distinctive wooden columns from the old Lodge for his home in Baraboo.

WILLIAM H. ASPINWALL



1906 - 1983 Exalted Ruler 1967 - 1968

William Harold "Bill" Aspinwall was born on July 31, 1906, in Hurley, Wisconsin, the son of Judge Peter H. Aspinwall and Margaret Eagan. He grew up in Hurley and came to Madison in 1924 to attend the University of Wisconsin where he excelled as a boxer. As a student in the School of Commerce, he worked two parttime jobs, including one in the UW athletic ticket office.

For 46 years Bill would work for the UW Athletic Department and was appointed its first accountant upon his graduation in 1928. He would go on to serve as business manager, ticket manager, and secretary to the UW Athletic Board. Upon his retirement, Bill was elected to the UW Athletic Hall of Fame. Aspinwall was a charter member of the College Athletics Business Managers Association (CABMA), served as it's secretary-treasurer and president, and was named "CABMA Man of the Year" in 1970.

On April 22, 1930, Aspinwall married Margaret S. Hubbell and the couple has three daughters and three sons. Bill was an avid golfer and bowler and a Life Member of Madison Elks Lodge 410. He was elected Exalted Ruler in 1967.

William H. Aspinwall died on January 19, 1983, and is buried with his wife in Madison's Resurrection Cemetery.

The Building and Grounds Committee would like to recognize member Lynn Lee for the beautiful holiday decorations in our bar. The Lodge looked very festive this holiday season thanks to Lynn!

We had to deal with a couple of heating and refrigeration issues this past month. Our HVAC company, Air Temperature Services, needed to repair motors that run fans on radiators. We also had a faulty zone valve which controls heat to the lower-level ladies' restroom that needed replacement. We also needed to call our refrigeration company, Just In Time Refrigeration, to do some maintenance on our walk-in cooler. Overall, nothing to be too concerned about and issues resolved.

We will be switching over to the Square Point of Sale System (POS) on December 29. We are hopeful that both improved software and hardware will improve the efficiency of our bar and restaurant operation. At the same time, we will be upgrading our Wi-Fi system for better speed and connectivity. These are both significant investments that will be an improvement to our infrastructure.

I'd like to remind everyone that we still have space available on our kayak rack at a cost of \$135 per year on a first-come, first-served basis. Spring will be here before you know it! If you'd like to reserve a spot, please email office@madisonelkslodge.org.

ELKS LEGACY AWARD SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

Who is eligible to apply for an ENF Legacy Award?

 If you are the child or grandchild (or stepchild, step-grandchild, or legal ward) of a living Elk who joined the order on or before April 1, 2023, or a charter member of a Lodge that was instituted on or after April 1, 2023. Your Elk sponsor must also be a paid-up member for the last two contiguous years



through March 31, 2026. Greatgrandchildren are not eligible. If your parent and grandparent are both Elk members, you should apply through the parent's Elks Lodge.

If you are high school senior. If you are
planning to attend an accredited U.S. school,
college or university? (Note: Applicants from
Guam, Panama, Puerto Rico and the
Philippines may apply Legacy Awards
toward schools, colleges or universities in
their respective homes.)

Applications must be submitted by noon on February 2, 2026, Pacific Time.

The Elks National Foundation is not responsible for any technical errors that may arise as you complete and submit your application. We especially encourage you to upload required documents early, even if you aren't ready to submit your application. In addition, it is in your best interest to submit your application early to avoid any last-minute web traffic problems. If your application is received after the contest deadline, it will be ineligible, regardless of the reason for late submission.

Legacy Awards winners will be announced in late April 2026.


