

Morton Forest Dedicated – Thank You Steve!

In what County executive Joe Parisi called "a generous and unselfish act," longtime Elks member Steve Morton has provided Dane county its newest park. Morton Forest is in Mazomanie, in the most beautiful part of the county. Everyone should see this beautiful park -- just go to Mazomanie on Highway 14 and turn left on Reeve Road – you will be there in a few miles. You can hike up the two gorgeous hills (one is over 1,000 feet), from which you can see miles. Or, you can hike, snowshoe or cross country ski on the lower forested trails.

Steve not only donated the land, he created an endowment sufficient to keep the park available to the public forever and paid for two shelters at the top of the hills, so visitors can enjoy the spectacular views. Darren Marsh, head of Dane County Parks, said "Steve has ensured the perpetual success of this park with his donation."

Steve's parents bought the original property of 81 acres in 1953, when he was twenty-one years old. They added 39 acres later. The family used it on weekends and socially. After his father died and left him the property Steve built a cabin to replace the original house, which had burned down, and added a well. The cabin is now a Nature Center that you can see from the road.

In 1990, Steve donated the land with a life estate, which he relinquished this August, when the park opened to the public. On October 17, 2016, the ribbon cutting and dedication was held, with many public officials attending.
