

This is an article written by Wind River, who is our new credit card processing company about our Exalted Ruler, Lynn:

There is a video that went viral on Facebook and YouTube. The theme was Paying it Forward. We wanted to share the story of one of our customers, Sonic Foundry, as our interactions with them reminded us of the video.

The mission at Sonic Foundry is to amplify the world's knowledge by empowering organizations to place video at the heart of every class, training, communication and event. Sonic Foundry was originally introduced to Wind River by TermSync, an Accounts Receivable automation solution founded by Mark Wilson, who once worked for Sonic Foundry.

"We were never really able to fully understand the different fee structures we were seeing in our credit card program at the Madison Elks. Wind River pointed out that our bundled pricing led to an annual overpayment of more than \$3,000 – that's real money to us."

Without knowing it, Sonic Foundry received additional benefits. By recommending the Madison Elks Lodge to Wind River, Sonic Foundry became an active part of the Wind River customer referral program.

TO OUR MEMBERS:

Over the last few weeks some Trustees and I have been receiving complaints from our staff about Lodge members and, on some occasions, their guests making rude and disrespectful comments to them. The offenders by and large are our more senior Elks. This has to stop! Our staff is our most valuable asset.

Our dining room is our biggest money loser. Our Executive Chef and General Manager Melissa has been working hard to change and is succeeding as there is a significant increase in meals served on Friday night. Melissa, her staff, and the Board are working to bring you to the dining room on other nights as well. What that means to all of us is, as more and more come to taste some truly delicious cuisine, you might not get your favorite table, server and may not be able to be seated immediately. That is not the staff's fault and not a reason to be discourteous to them.

We again need to ask our members to make reservations in the dining room as far in advance as possible. This gives us the ability to have adequate staff on hand. We all recognize that that is not always possible to make advance reservations and we do not by any means want to discourage you from dining at the Lodge. Just know that there could be a longer wait. Melissa's biggest challenge is to find quality staff. Recently, there were over 900 ads for kitchen/wait staff on Craig's List. Our Lodge is fortunate that we can afford to hire good people to serve us. In many Lodges the membership is responsible for most of the duties we are able to pay for. If we are not able to hire staff to serve food, that responsibility would fall on the Lodge members. I am certain no volunteer would tolerate some of the comments made by Lodge members to our staff.

The Lodge recently started using OpenTable a reservation program in response to increased reservations and our desire to make certain that it was received. The program also allows us to pace the seating based on available staff and the kitchen's ability to put out quality food (realize that Melissa cooks from scratch and not out of a bag). If there are empty tables when you ask to be seated and you are told it will be a while realize that our ability to serve and prepare your food is limited. One of the biggest complaints we have heard is the long wait once seated. Our wait staff and kitchen can only physically prepare and serve so many members and their guests at one time. That is why there are empty tables.

We do well at our Lodge in supporting our bar. We realize there are occasional waits for service. The same explanation applies in terms of staffing. You likely have noticed officers, PER's and members stepping in to help out in the busy times. The word "round" in another sense applies here. Our bartenders are instructed to make their way around the bar so that everyone has a chance to be served a delicious adult beverage regardless of their location as timely as possible. If it is busy, please don't engage our bar staff in conversation until things slow down. They do not want to be short with you, rather they want to provide great serve to all.

As you know your guests are most welcome. Guests are your responsibility. So, when a guest made a comment that was heard by Josh the bartender wondering where we got him; "from prison" that is on the member inviting the guest. To Josh's credit he moved on and providing great service. This example is illustration of the type of comments received by our staff. Josh in the short time here has gained a reputation as a great bartender, waiter, host, and friend to many members.

Just as all Elks are family, so are the staffs that support our missions. While we are a private club, we are not a country club where there are spending minimums that fund large numbers of staff. Please be patient when patience is called for, help out when you can and enjoy your Lodge.

Dear Elks Members and Business Owners,

One of our members recently reached out to the Elks to see if we could help a community of aged and disabled adults living on the Triangle in Madison. The residents who live in this subsidized housing community of 335 units all disabled and/or elderly folks who live on extremely low to low income. Many people who live here are Veterans, many are people who have experienced hardships in life mostly due to medical conditions, and many struggle with mental illnesses. Most survive on the meager governmental monthly benefit and \$16 in food stamps.

The funds that we have received from the Elks National Foundation will assist the residents at the Triangle with donations of bus passes and cab vouchers to help them get to their medical appointments, pharmacy or grocery stores. As part of our Freedom Grant, we are also putting together "Thank You for Your Service" bags to give to the residents and other homeless Veterans in our community. We have purchased reusable tote bags that we will be selling at the Lodge for \$5.00 each with the proceeds going to help us benefit our mission. Please consider purchasing one or more tote bags to help our cause the next time you are at the Lodge!

We are also asking for donations of soap, shampoo, deodorant, tooth brushes and toothpaste to help us fill our bags. As an Elks member, please ask your Dentist or Doctor's office if they would be willing to help with any of these items. If you are traveling, please ask at your hotel stay if they would be able to give up a few extra complementary toiletry items that they supply in your room. If you're at the gas station or grocery store, please spend a little more to purchase a gift card of any amount in order to add to our bags. The more contributions we receive, the more Veterans we can help!

We are celebrating Veteran's Day at the Lodge on November 11th and hope that you will join us for breakfast! We will be taking your donations at the Lodge through the month of November or if you would like to make a cash donation to help you may send it to the Lodge marked Freedom Grant in the memo line.
